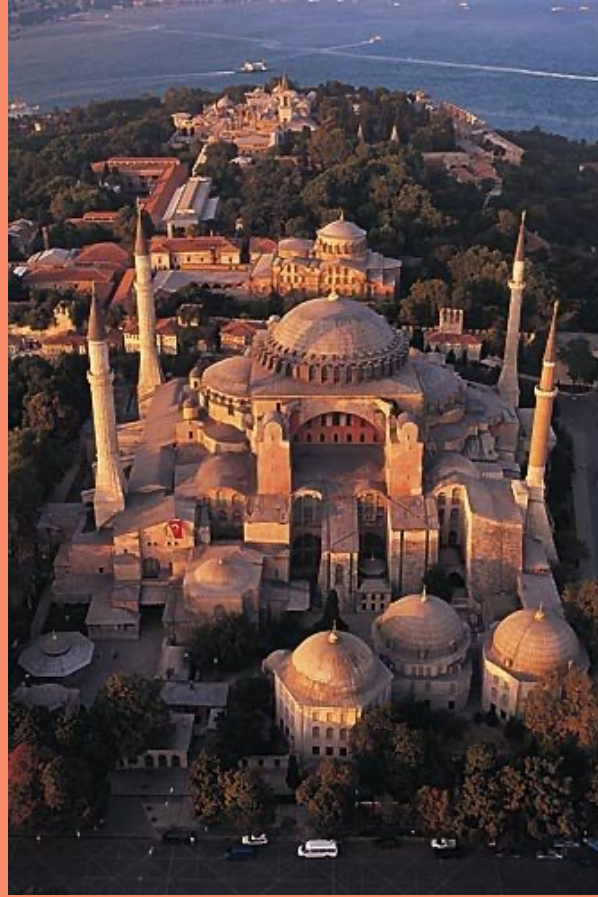

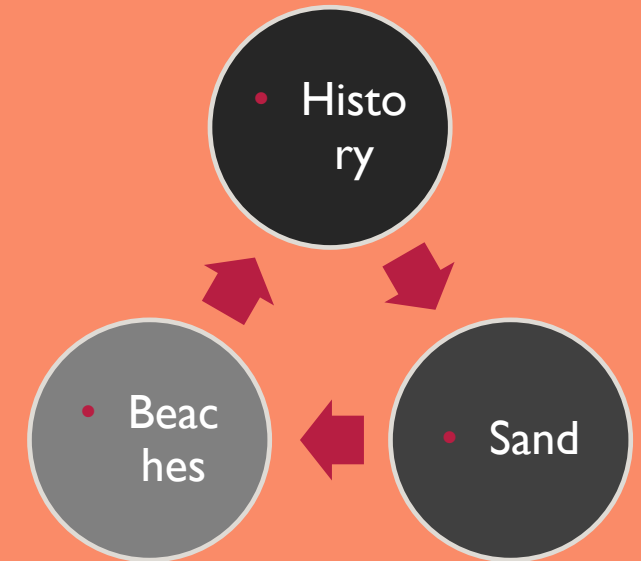
Bosphorus
